NEW BUSINESS

1. Privately-Funded Projects

Kat Wright

a. "Calling It Done" by Brian Owens/Jessie Ball duPont Fund Artwork Donation

The project consists of two bronze sculptures and one cast stone piano sculpture, which was privately funded by the Jessie Ball duPont Fund, who contracted the CCGJ to administer the public art project installed at the renovated and reopened Live Ev'ry Voice and Sing Park in Lavilla. The Park recently celebrated its opening on June 27, 2024. The bronze sculptures depict Jacksonville natives, James Weldon Johnson and J. Rosamond Johnson, who wrote the hymn "Lift Ev'ry Voice and Sing", which is widely acknowledged as the Black National Anthem. The cast stone piano features a bronze plaque on the rear of the piano containing the lyrics of the hymn. All of the artwork elements are valued at \$242,000. A bronze plaque crediting Mr. Owens and featuring an Artist statement is located in the passive garden adjacent to the artwork.

Staff states that the overall project budget was \$300,000, which includes the CCGJ's project administrative fees and a \$24,200 reserve for maintenance and conservation that is required for donation into the Arts in Public Places Permanent Public Art Collection.

Staff invites the APPC to reference the Public Art Catalog Form and shares in the presentation slide deck other information provided by the Artist to maintain and care for the artwork. Staff also displayed material samples for Staff to keep on file. All expressed gratitude for the care and intentionality exhibited by Mr. Owens.

Motion: The Art in Public Places Committee accepts the donation of the sculpture "Calling it Done" valued at \$242,000 by artist Brian Owens from the Placemaking and Equity Fund of the Jessie Ball duPont Fund into the Art in Public Places Permanent Collection with a maintenance set aside of \$24,200 deposited into the APP Trust for maintenance and repair as needed. The Department of Parks, Recreation and Community Services recommended that the facility's new Recreation Supervisor, Mawiya Charles, serve as the Site Representative on the Panel pending APPC vote and approval.

OLD BUSINESS / PROJECT UPDATES

b. Roosevelt/Edgewood Underpass Lighting and Artwork Project

The Roosevelt/Edgewood Artistic Lighting and Artwork project complements Florida Department of Transportation's (FDOT's) efforts to improve Edgewood Avenue by conducting repairs and a cleaning of the underpass. As the structure is owned by FDOT, careful coordination and planning by the City, CCGJ and FDOT took place to ensure that both the sculptural lighting activation on the underdeck and mural on the sidewall leading into the Avondale community would not be a safety risk to pedestrians or motorists. Staff shared an image of the location before the implementation of the mural and after it was enhanced by David Nackashi's *The Birds on 17*. The mural is protected with an anti-sacrificial coating provided by an FDOT subcontractor. The APPC voiced that they were pleased with the outcome considering the time and design constraints imposed by FDOT.

Staff shares that the lighting fixtures for the sculptural lighting activation have been installed, components have been field checked, and that the addresses are being collected by FDOT subcontractors for the commissioned artist, Bill Fitzgibbons, to begin designing the activation subject to FDOT's approval of colors. The colors in the activation may not be interpreted as traffic signals. Staff is engaging a local lighting specialist from SESCO Lighting to perform fieldwork with FDOT to pre-vet colors prior to the artist's travel in late August/early September to conduct final programming of the activation. The APPC anticipates that this project will garner positive attention for its ability to create more lighting in an otherwise dim location.

Staff shares that the sculpture *On Allison's Wings* by Main Made Studios, honoring the legacy of Allison Haramis and the nonprofit, Angels for Allison, will likely be installed on July 25th. The sculpture is constructed of corten and stainless steel and will be installed on an existing pedestal within Stockton Park. The COJ Parks, Recreation, and Community Services Department is providing an in-kind donation of landscaping, electricity and ground uplighting to enhance the artwork. The APPC expressed their gratitude for the additional support.
